

## **Implementation Guidelines for “International Affairs” Credit Program, Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages**

Applicable after the first semester of the academic year of 2015  
Approved at the Academic Affairs Committee on January 6, 2015

- I. Program name: International Affairs Credit Program
- II. Program coordinator: Department of International Affairs
- III. Program planning departments: Department of International Affairs
- IV. Program objectives:  
On the basis of students’ foreign language ability and knowledge of international cultures, this program aims to cultivate outstanding political and economic talents with the ability to communicate in foreign languages and professional knowledge about international affairs to meet the demands of government and society.
- V. Qualifications for application:  
Sophomore students of the four-year college program (or above), junior students of the two-year college program (or above) and graduate students can apply before the end of the first semester of their last academic year (excluding students who delay graduation).
- VI. Application and evaluation procedures:  
Before the deadline announced by the Registration Section, applicants should complete the application form for the program to be signed by the chairperson of their department. They should then submit the application form to the Department of International Affairs. Upon evaluation and approval, the list of students who can join the program will be announced on the university website by the Registration Section.
- VII. Credits: The minimum requirement is 21 credits. For students who take the credit program, at least one-half of credits taken should not be one of the following:
  - (1) courses offered in the student’s own major (excluding cross-disciplinary courses stipulated by the department or graduate school)
  - (2) courses offered in the student’s own double major
  - (3) courses offered in the student’s own minor
- VIII. Regulations for the issue of program certificate:
  - (1) Review of qualifications: The department in charge of the program should complete the qualification review before students graduate.

- (2) Issue of certificates: According to the results of qualification review provided by the department in charge of the program, the Registration Section should ask for the approval from the Dean of Academic Affairs. Upon approval, the University will issue the certificate for the “International Affairs” credit program.
