

## **“Cross-Strait Relations Studies Program”, Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages**

- I. Program name: Cross-Strait Relations Studies Program
- II. Planning department: Department of International Affairs
- III. Coordinating and review departments: Department of International Affairs, Department of International Business Administration, General Education Center
- IV. Program objectives:
  - (I) This program aims to provide students of the University with complete training for China studies and the study s of cross-Strait relations.
  - (II) Teaching, research and human resources of the University are integrated through inter-departmental collaboration to provide training for studies on cross-Strait politics, economics, culture, and regional politics and economics.
- V. Qualifications for application:

Sophomores of the four-year college program (or above) of the University and students of other colleges/universities in the strategic alliance with the University
- VI. Application and evaluation procedures:
  - (I) Information required: Applicants should submit application forms and Chinese transcripts of records.
  - (II) Due dates: The due dates will be announced at the beginning of the semester according to the university calendar.
  - (III) Announcement of results: Upon evaluation and approval, the list of students who can join the program will be announced on the website of the Department of International Affairs and the university bulletin board.
  - (IV) Issue of certificates: Students who have taken all the required compulsory and elective courses and whose credits have been approved will receive the certificate for the Cross-Strait Relations Studies program upon approval of the Dean of Academic Affairs and the President.
- VII. Credits:
  - (I) Students who take the program should acquire at least 20 credits, including 11 credits of compulsory courses. Apart from the compulsory courses, students can take elective courses according to their own major and their interest, but the total number of credits acquired should not exceed the maximum limit of 28 credits.
  - (II) Students who have not registered to take part in the program can take elective courses from the program and the credits taken can be recognized as professional or general elective courses by their own departments.

VIII. Registration fees: 500 NTD

IX. Regulations for the issue of program certificate:

- (I) Application deadline: Students who meet the requirements of the program should submit their application to the program center one month before graduation.
- (II) Information required: Applicant should submit a copy of Chinese transcript of records issued by the Registration Section to the Department of International Affairs.
- (III) Issue of certificates: Students who have acquired all the required compulsory and elective courses and whose credits have been approved will receive the certificate of the Cross-Strait Relations Studies program upon approval of the Dean of Academic Affairs and the President.
