

Pre-requisite Guidelines for Bachelor's Degree Programs at Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages

Passed by the Academic Affairs Meeting on May 21st, 2024
Approved by the President of the university on June 5th, 2024

- I. To encourage students with excellent performances in the five-year junior college program to stay in the university Bachelor's degree program and continue their studies within a shorter time, the school has set the “Pre-requisite Guidelines for Bachelor's Degree Programs at Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages” (referred to as “this guideline” below.)
- II. The university's bachelor's degree programs may establish “Pre-requisite Selection Regulations for Bachelor's Degree Programs” according to this guideline, selecting outstanding students in their third year or above from junior college divisions to enroll in bachelor's degree program courses (referred to below as pre-requisite students).
- III. The “Pre-requisite Selection Regulations for Bachelor's Degree Programs” established by each department should include criteria for selection, selection methods, grading methods, credit exemption policies, etc. These regulations must be approved by departmental meetings, college meetings, and academic affairs meetings, and implemented after approval by the President.
- IV. Each department may set its own selection schedule and submit the list of selected pre-requisite students to the Office of Academic Affairs for review before the start of each semester.
- V. Pre-requisite students must still participate in the two-year entrance exam or four-year transfer exam. They will formally qualify as bachelor's degree students upon passing these examinations.
- VI. Each department should assist pre-requisite students in course selection, conduct regular evaluations, and manage student course selection under the regulations for course selection.
- VII. After obtaining admission qualifications for the university's bachelor's degree programs, pre-requisite students who achieve a grade of sixty or above in courses taken at the junior college division may apply for credit exemption without being subject to the restriction of having to complete half of the required graduation credits. However, subjects already counted towards junior college graduation credits cannot be exempted again.
- VIII. Any matters not covered by these guidelines shall be handled following relevant regulations.
- IX. This guideline has been approved by the Academic Affairs Meeting and will be implemented after approval by the President. The same procedure applies for any amendments.
